Settle claims quickly with the **European Small Claims Procedure**

36% of Europeans buy online from another EU country, others buy from abroad when travelling. We now have more choice than ever, but things don't always go smoothly. If you've had problems with goods or services bought abroad and want to claim damages, the European Small Claims Procedure could be for you.



What's it for?

CLAIMS FOR DAMAGES RELATED TO PURCHASES MADE IN ANOTHER EU COUNTRY Goods or services







CLAIMS FOR... Money or other forms of compensation





WORTH... **€** 5 000 or less



A quicker, easier and cheaper route to getting damages







Written procedure | Multilingual forms | No legal representation required





Court-fees only obligatory fee | Built-in deadlines for timely settlements







5 steps to settlement

1. COLLECT EVIDENCE

2. FILL IN CLAIM FORM

Get the form from your court or online.

Your local legal or consumer advice centre can help you fill it in if required.

3. SEND FORM TO THE COURT

Include supporting documents such as: Orders / Receipts / Photos

4. COURT ASSESSES CLAIM

Checks if claim is:

In the scope of the procedure / Well-founded



Claim unfounded L Claim dismissed.



Claim out of scope of procedure Laim withdrawn. or applicant can proceed under closest appropriate national procedure.







5. JUDGEMENT

has to judge or request more information. In some rarer cases the court may decide to convene an oral hearing. The hearing may be conducted by videoconference, if possible.
